1. Applicants must pass an English language admission test and an interview in English in accordance with the University's Regulations regarding the selection of prospective graduate students.
2. Applicants must submit a score of TU-GET, TOEFL or IELTS. (Test results must not exceed two years by the application date.)
3. Other terms and conditions must correspond to the announcements of the graduate student selection procedures by Thammasat University and the Language Institute.

Objectives

Graduates of this program are expected to

1. possess knowledge, competence, and proficiency in all four English skills, i.e. listening, speaking, reading and writing to be effectively applied to their careers
2. possess knowledge, competence, and proficiency in advanced English essential for analysis of and research into the English language for their work experience and career development
3. possess knowledge, competence, and proficiency in English to meet the increasing language needs
